FISH WEIGHT COMPETITIONS

If you are a member and have 'caught the big one' have it weighed. There are two competitions running side by side during the year.

Each month there is a Fish of the Month (see calendar of events on the membership page for details) and all who catch one of the fish of the month species goes onto the All Rounder Board. Points are awarded for the heaviest down to the 'hey, you caught one' accordingly. At the end of the year the points are tallied to see who the All Rounder is for the year catching a diversity of fish from river to sea

The second competition runs all year round and it is who has caught the heaviest of each species by the 30th June.

Sections include MENS, LADIES, BOYS and GIRLS.

All fish are to be weighed at an official weigh station.

These include:

- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Eden Amateur Fishing Club Inc clubhouse at Quarantine Bay, Eden.
- Eden Outdoor and Marine in the main shopping centre in Eden.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Matildas Shop n Go at the top of the hill as you head south out of Eden.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Kiah General Store on the highway 12 minutes drive south of Eden.
- · Wonboyn General Store 33kms south of Eden in the beautiful village of Wonboyn.
- · Shell Bait & Fuel Service Station Betka Road, Mallacoota, Victoria.
- · Alpine Angler Snowy Mountains Highway, Cooma.

It is the responsibility of every angler to make sure their fish receipt is correct when weigh in occurs. All weighdockets are valid for two months only.

Vic boating regulations: It came to notice through a recent incident involving a member that watercraft of any description must be registered in Vic if driven by any type of motor. For example a kayak powered by an electric motor must be registered. Heavy fines apply.

Membership renewals: These fall due on June 30th and a renewal form is included herein.

Shirt order: I have one order for a shirt with a name; if anyone else would like one please let me know ASAP.

Purchase of mower: Members responsible for organising and manning the Bilo sausage sizzle have suggested we purchase a new mower from the proceeds and this is under consideration.

AGM and presentation night: This will be held on Saturday July 26th, if have an item that you would like to see included in the agenda, please send it to the Secretary before July 4th.

And don't forget that all competitions end on June 30th and we need to have your fish dockets by July 3rd for ordering trophies.
