FISH WEIGHT COMPETITIONS

If you are a member and "have caught the big one" have it weighed! The club has competitions running throughout the year. To enter the competitions, weigh tickets must be presented to the Weigh master.

Our major competition is for the **Heaviest Fish**. The weight of the heaviest fish in a nominated list of species is recorded for the period from 1 July to 30 June. There are four categories in this competition: Men, Ladies, Boys and Girls. The angler who catches the heaviest fish in a species in each category during the year receives a trophy at our presentation night.

The angler from any category who catches the largest number of heaviest fish is awarded the Club Champion trophy.

Also from within this competition, one fish is selected by the committee in each of the categories (Men, Ladies, Boys and Girls) each year for the **Most Meritorious Fish** award.

The second competition is our **Fish of the Month** competition. This competition has three categories, Men, Ladies and Juniors. At the beginning of the year, a nominated species of fish is chosen for each month as the Fish of the Month. The list is published in the Newsletter and on the Website. In any month, the angler submitting a weigh ticket for the heaviest nominated fish in a category is awarded a cash prize.

The angler with the heaviest fish is also awarded 3 points, the angler with the next heaviest fish receives 2 points, and all anglers submitting a weigh ticket for the species of the month receive 1 point. Points are tallied throughout the year and an **All Rounder Award** is presented to the angler scoring the highest number of points by the end of the year, for Seniors (from Men and Ladies) and for Juniors (from Boys and Girls).

EAFC weigh stations include:

- Eden Amateur Fishing Club Inc clubhouse at Quarantine Bay, Eden.
- Eden Outdoor and Marine in the main shopping centre in Eden.
- Matildas Shop n Go at the top of the hill as you head south out of Eden.
- · Kiah General Store on the highway 12 minutes drive south of Eden.
- · Wonboyn General Store 33kms south of Eden in the beautiful village of Wonboyn.
- · Shell Bait & Fuel Service Station Betka Road, Mallacoota, Victoria.
- · Alpine Angler Snowy Mountains Highway, Cooma.

It is the responsibility of every angler to make sure their fish receipt is correct when weigh in occurs. All weighdockets are valid for two months only.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



President's Report December 2014

Greetings once again everyone,

Its Christmas Party time again and ours is over for another year. Thanks to our head caterer Gwen, her wonderful helpers, those who contributed salads and sweets and the two fine men who cooked the meat. He was successful too, topping Gordon's 0.800 kg effort with a fish of 1.050 kg. Gordon could be considered a little unlucky though as he had picked up a 1.270 kg Luderick in the wrong month, that's fishing though and he takes the lead in the yearly comp.

Congratulations all of the winners, to the rest of you, try harder in future.

December FOTM: This is the wily little Whiting, plenty of them around in the estuaries before the rain but they could be harder to find now.

January FOTM : The new year is almost here so get geared up for the mighty Slimy Mackerel, the winners to be announced along with the December Whiting at the Seafood Night on January 31st.

Tuross Head Visit: A couple of weeks earlier, members from the Tuross Head club came to town for a weekend of fishing and fun. Twenty six visitors and a much larger than expected roll up of our members saw a massive field of 65 anglers contest the mini-comp. The winners were team Drop Bear, members were Tash Jones and Jane Stevens from Tuross and Emma Tan, Dave Inge and Michael Lucas from Eden. The latter was to catch many more undersized and rubbish fish than any other angler for a terrible score of minus 22 points.

This in the end secured the win for his team when a twist saw negative points changed to positive points therefore steeling the win from the best performed team on the day, the members of which who would rightly have felt gutted by this turn of events. It was a big couple of days and a big ask for a small group of workers, we will try do better next time.

Life Membership procedures: EAFC has formulated a procedure, guidelines and criteria to be followed in nominating a member for Life Membership. To date the existence of this document has not been well publicised but it is available through contacting a member of the committee. This is the first step in putting forward a nomination and is to be followed by a written submission addressing the requirements of the document. A form to assist in this is available.

Fishing report: The Kingfish are having a bit of a go occasionally but you will probably have to discard a lot of rats before boating a keeper. Terry Carson has set the bar at a reasonable height in the yearly comp with his good 12.230 kg Kingie. A few Yellowfin have been landed out around the shelf but ocean fishing is still generally quiet. Bag limits of flathead are being filled occasionally but remember that under the new rules this is only ten fish per person. Only a few reef fish have been spotted on the cleaning tables. On the other hand the estuaries and lakes are fishing well with good catches of Bream, Whiting and Luderick reported.

A few Duskies have been caught as well and the beaches are producing some big salmon.

The above was the case before the recent heavy rains which will certainly have some detrimental effects in the short term but we should see some benefits as the mud settles.

Shed Extensions: In news just received, we have been successful in receiving State Government funding to the tune of \$5,000 for the roof extension. Fritz prepared the submission so well done and thank you Fritz. We will proceed with this work as soon as council approval is received.

This is the last report for the year 2014, it has been another good one for the club. The outstanding success of the March competition was definitely a highlight but it was the continued strong support for all activities by you, the members that gave the most satisfaction.

The committee thanks you for that support and wishes you all the best for the festive season and we look forward to seeing all in 2015.

CATCH AND RELEASE COMPETITION

Catch and Release for Bream

Rules of the Catch and Release Bream Challenge:

Bream of either the Yellowfin or Southern Black species are to be measured on a NSW DPI brag mat and photographed to clearly show the total length of the fish from the tip of its nose to the tip of its tail and the date and time that the fish was photographed.

A printed photo must then be presented to the weigh master who will record the length to the nearest millimetre and the date of capture and will issue a receipt showing these details. The onus is always on the member to provide clear proof of their catch.

There is only one category for all members, male or female, senior or junior in this competition. The current competition leader will be printed in the newsletter and a trophy or a perpetual shield will be presented at the AGM.

Short description of the competition: The longest catch and release Bream caught for the year wins the prize, one category only for all members, all Bream are treated as the one species. In the event that fish of the same length are caught, as in all of our competitions, the fish first on the board is the one to beat.

Large Bream are magnificent looking creatures and many anglers, including myself, prefer to release them. This competition will allow anglers to do that and still have their achievement recognized. No other competition is changed in any way so this one will not impact at all on those who wish to keep their catch. The club does encourage sustainable fishing practices, including catch and release, and it's to be hoped that this competition is embraced in the intended spirit and all fish entered are released unharmed.

Our annual Christmas event for 2014


